Community Researchers FAQs



What does the taking part involve?

With our support you will work in pairs to interview people in your community and gather their thoughts, opinions, and experiences of energy-efficient home improvement schemes.

Your knowledge of your local area and the people who live there will be essential, as you will identify opportunities and locations to engage with members of your community.

Will I get any training?

You will receive 4 days of training to help you confidently take part. Training will cover community research approaches and facilitation skills. Shortwork will provide the training, which will take place in person in Manchester.

How many hours will I work?

Most community researchers will participate in around 7 days on the project between Sept 2024 and Jan 2025, including training sessions. These will be a mixture of full or half-day sessions. Hours will be flexible so you can fit the project around other commitments.

How much will I be paid?

You will be paid by Carbon Co-op for your involvement at £12 per hour.

Where will I participate?

Community research sessions will take place in various community venues across Manchester.

Who can be a Community Researcher?

Community researchers come from diverse backgrounds and can be anyone aged 18+. Some may have links to the community through volunteering, work or education. Others live locally. Experience in community research or speaking a community language is beneficial but not essential.

Are there any other benefits?

After the research there will be more opportunities to:

- Work with housing providers, contractors, and communities to design and test tenant-focused tools and resources.
- Share research findings with policymakers and serve as the voice of tenants at regional and national events.
